The Connecticut River Long Distance River Race was held May 9 starting at Eagles Landing State Park near the Goodspeed Opera House running down nearly to the Baldwin Bridge before heading back upstream to the finish line just south of Pettipaug YC. 45 boats competed including 10 MC scows which started in the third heat along with the 6 Buccaneers. It was tight racing for the MCs for much of the day with many lead changes. As they approached the Essex area it was Bob Wynkoop, Keith Kraner, Devon Howe and Chris Moore working for every opportunity to advantage themselves in the shifty 7 knot wind and strong current. With Kraner on his heels Wynkoop worked into the lead. Plenty of food and frivolity at PYC ensued after all he boats were back on their trailers.





It was a day in May, perhaps 2010 and it was my first Commodore's Handicap Race and Commissioning. Bob Scholes, past Commodore had



just passed the baton to Cameron Taylor. Cameron was sporting a 420 this day. There were at least 25 boats at the start and the wind picked-up. I had asked my dear friend Karin Badger if I could borrow

her husband Jim Pinno to skipper my stable but extremely slow O'Day Widgeon. Jim had both skippered and crewed on large boats, had a formidable career as a sailmaker and was currently employed by Brewer's Yacht Yard in Branford. Neither of us had ever sailed in a small boat on the Connecticut River during a spring freshet and the wakes of large powerboats.

The day was exquisite, the water cold and choppy and it was a slalom course around the debris coming down from the north (we fortunately did not capsize). Ed Birch took this great photo of us as he went zipping by, leaving us in his wake. I cherish this photo and I cherish that day on the Connecticut River. Jim Pinno died last January. What a Lucky Duck I was to have this memory of Jim and me in my Widgeon.
