
MID-SUMMER PARTY & MARINE TAG SALE

Bill got up early the first day, helped with all the necessary measuring etc. and spent an hour or so sitting with Deborah on the rocks pointing out how the tide flowed with a strong current and that there were barges to watch out for, etc. etc. Now, it turned out that she and her crew did not make the weight limit so they had to take a 3rd crew. Fortunately, one of our SSYC friends had brought their small eight year old son with them and he was promptly enlisted and was put forward almost under the foredeck with the spinnaker bucket, anchor and sponge(all which were measurement requirements). Now, off to the starting line – and – just as the flag went up to start his jumping beans fell out of his pocket and started jumping up and down between the floorboards. Of course, everyone in the boat went to grab them moving this way and that, falling over each other in the process, but, wouldn't you know, they were first over the line!!

The next adventure that day was Debbi's crew member falling
